#### Rewards Program

Our Student Reward Program is an incentive based-program that awards students with points for outstanding monthly attendance, participating in activities, and/or completing one of their goals. Each goal has a preassigned point value. Students should notify their teacher when they achieve a goal.

Once a month, students receive a statement with the amount of points they have earned. Their points can be redeemed for rewards (prizes/gifts) at the AAEC Reward Center when it is open. Dates will be posted in the Melting Pot Newsletter. Each class will have a specific time to visit the center.

Students can save and accumulate their points to get bigger rewards or cash in their points each month. The Reward Center is located outside of ROOM 3 on the first floor. Giovanna, our Student and Staff Support person, is responsible for the Reward Program.













Reward Points are only valid for the 2023-2024 school year.

Reward Points are non-transferable. You cannot give your Reward Points to another student.

Remember to redeem your points before the end of the school year or before leaving the program.

#### **CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHTS**

#### ESOL classes at Mass. Alliance for Portuguese Speakers (MAPS)





At MAPS, everything is progressing smoothly. Engaging in English conversations with fellow students is a daily activity. Each day, before the commencement of classes and during breaks, students from both classes convene for "sharing time." During this period, they discuss their previous day's activities, plans for after class or the upcoming weekend, and exchange stories about their native countries and cultures. This interaction fosters learning and camaraderie among them.

#### High School Equivalency (HSE) - AM In person

The Massachusetts High School Equivalency credential is issued by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to those who have passed the HiSET® exam, the GED® exam, or a combination of all subject tests from both exams. #### CITIZENSHIP CORNER

#### Citizenship Vocabulary Words to Know:

Naturalization is the way that a person not born in the United States voluntarily becomes a U.S. citizen.

**United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS)** is the government agency that administers lawful immigration to the United States. It also manages U.S. citizenship and naturalization.

Many lawful permanent residents, or Green Card holders, are interested in becoming U.S. citizens. Why? According to USCIS, citizenship status offers many benefits.

Here are some important reasons to consider U.S. citizenship:



#### Vote.

Only citizens can vote in federal elections. Most states also restrict the right to vote, in most elections, to U.S. citizens.

#### Serve on a jury.

Only U.S. citizens can serve on a federal jury. Most states also restrict jury service to U.S. citizens. Serving on a jury is an important responsibility for U.S. citizens.

#### Travel with a U.S. passport.

A U.S. passport enables you to get assistance from the U.S. government when overseas, if necessary.

#### Bring family members to the U.S.

U.S. citizens generally get priority when petitioning to bring family members permanently to this country.

#### Obtain citizenship for children under 18 years of age.

In most cases, a child born abroad to a U.S. citizen is automatically a U.S. citizen.

#### Apply for federal jobs.

Certain jobs with government agencies require U.S. citizenship.

#### Become an elected official.

Only citizens can run for federal office (U.S. Senate or House of Representatives) and for most state and local offices.

#### Keep your residency.

A U.S. citizen's right to remain in the United States cannot be taken away.

#### Become eligible for federal grants and scholarships.

Many financial aid grants, including college scholarships and funds given by the government for specific purposes, are available only to U.S. citizens.

#### Obtain government benefits.

Some government benefits are available only to U.S. citizens.

#### **Tips for Preventing a Kitchen Fire:**

- Always remain in the kitchen when cooking. Unattended cooking is the number one cause of home fires according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA).
- Unplug any countertop appliances when they are not in use, like toasters and coffee machines.
- Install smoke detectors on every level of your home, as well as in each bedroom, and residential fire extinguishers.
- Smother a grease fire—Never use WATER!
- Keep electrical appliances away from water.

#### Free COVID-19 Tests



## Get four free at-home COVID –19 tests this fall on COVIDTests.gov.

As of September 25, 2023, residential households in the U.S. can order one set of 4 free at-home tests from USPS.com again.

- Limit of one order per residential address.
- One order includes #4 individual rapid antigen COVID-19 tests (<u>COVIDTests.gov has more details about at-home</u> tests, including extended shelf life and updated expiration dates).

#### Common Housing Application for Massachusetts Programs (CHAMP)

CHAMP (Common Housing Application for Massachusetts Program) is the website where you can apply for the Massachusetts state-aided Public Housing program, the Massachusetts Rental Voucher Program (MRVP), and the Alternative Housing Voucher Program (AHVP). Through the online system, this website lets you submit your application to one or more housing agencies, instead of having to mail or hand deliver an application to each housing agency separately. You can also keep your application information up-to-date on this website as it changes. This will help you to make sure that housing agencies know how to contact you.

If you have an active application at one or more local housing agencies, you can find it on this website and manage it on this website. Do not file a new application. Once you find your existing application on the website, you can make changes such as updating contact information and adding or removing your applications to housing agencies. It is important to only apply to those housing agencies where you are willing to live.

Other voucher programs and federally subsidized public housing units are not available through this site. However, if you are interested in applying for those programs, please contact a <u>local housing agency</u> directly.


