Online Application Opens: January 24, 2025, 9 am Online Application Deadline: February 26, 2025, 11pm



No scholarship money will be issued to students until the Greater Lowell Community Foundation (GLCF) and/or Lowell High School certifies that the award will be made. Certain scholarships listed in this bulletin include an anticipated award amount based on last year's awards, which may or may not be available. Scholarships for which the anticipated amount is unknown are designated as TBD (To Be Determined). Recipients who are selected to receive a scholarship, must submit a college enrollment letter directly to the GLCF before the scholarship can be issued.

To apply eligible students <u>must</u> have a minimum 2.5 GPA, attended Lowell High School as a Junior, will further his/her education in the Fall 2025, and meets other eligibility criteria specified by individual scholarships.

1. Online Application Requirements:

Students must create a scholarship account via Naviance "HN Scholarship App" link or log onto

and submit the following required scholarship materials online to be considered:

- a. Lowell High School Honors Night Scholarship Application (complete all questions)
- b. Required Essay (copy & paste online, maximum 300 words)
- c. Any other required documents: extra essays, poems, short stories and/or letters of recommendation (apply early-will only know eligibility after submission, excluding Tsongas)
- d. ID Only Transcript (to be loaded by student) This must be the ID Only transcript with Semester 1 grades: available Feb. 7-13th in Aspen.

SECTION I

<u>Arts</u>

1. John H. Costello Book Award*

Book Award

Awarded to an outstanding student who is pursuing a career in music.

2. John H. Costello Memorial Scholarship

\$1,000

Awarded to students who demonstrate financial need. Applicants must have participated in community service and either music or athletics.

3. Eileen Marjorie McGuire Donahue Scholarship Fund

\$1,000 - \$1,499

Awarded to graduating seniors from LHS who will pursue a college degree in music, with a preference in choral/voice study.

4. John J. Giblin Music Scholarship Fund*

\$500 - \$999

Awarded to students who intend to pursue study in the arts or music.

5. Julia Hassan Memorial Scholarship (11th & 12th GRADES)

\$1,000

Awarded to a junior or senior taking musical arts at Lowell High School who will upgrade from a student instrument to a professional instrument to prepare for the college audition process. Proof of deposit on professional instrument is required.

Applicants must submit an essay online on the following topic: Explain why a new instrument is needed and describe your future goals (500 words).

6. LHS Visual Arts Scholarship Fund

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to deserving seniors who plan to attend a **four-year** college or university and major in art history, art education, or a visual arts discipline. Students must have a GPA of 3.5 or higher. Students must submit additional documents online, as required below.

Application requirements:

- Submit an online portfolio that demonstrates outstanding achievement in the arts.
- Submit an additional essay on the following topic: "How a college education will help me achieve my goal to be an artist, designer, or art educator."

7. Lowell Summer Music Series Fund

\$500

Awarded to graduating seniors in the Fine Arts Pathway at LHS who plan to continue their education in the fine arts.

8. Grady Mulligan Scholarship Fund

\$1,000 - \$1,499

Awarded to students who plan to pursue a college education in any aspect of the performing or visual arts.

9. Joseph G. Pyne School Scholarship

\$250

Awarded to students who attended the Joseph G. Pyne Arts School for a minimum of four years and graduated from the school who demonstrate academic potential and personal character. The student must plan to attend a college, vocational or technical school, or any accredited school of higher learning.

10. Stephen Tousignant Music Memorial Scholarship Fund*

\$500 - \$999

Awarded to graduating instrumental (preferably woodwind) students from LHS who plan to major in music or music education in college.

11. B. Douglas Townshend Choral Arts Scholarship Fund*

\$500

Awarded to a student going into music. Priority will follow this schedule: 1) choral arts student, voice

major; 2) music education; 3) music performance, vocal major; 4) music performance, instrumental major; 5) music major, stage/film.

12. Ellenor T. Trull Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to students who plan to major in fine arts or graphic design.

13. Western Ave Artist Association Scholarship Fund

\$450

Awarded to graduating seniors who plan to study art at a two- or four-year college or university.

Athletics

14. Gerald C. Barnes II Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to graduating seniors who plan to attend either a two or **four-year** college or university and has been involved in community service and extracurricular activities. Preference given to 2-year lacrosse players. (Awarded at LHS Athletic Awards Banquet)

15. Colleen Creegan Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$500 - \$999

Awarded to members of the LHS Cheerleading Squad.

16. George C. Eliades Jr. and Mary Lou Eliades Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to a Lowell High School senior attending a two-year college or **four-year** college with strong academic performance and sports.

17. Martin "Mickey" Finn Scholarship

\$500

Applicants must have previously participated in the Centerville Baseball League and have a minimum 3.0 GPA.

Applicants must submit an additional, brief essay online discussing how they benefited from playing recreational baseball.

18. Leo and Matthew Flynn Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$1,000 - \$1,499

Awarded to students with financial need and at least a B average who have demonstrated leadership in community/civic activities and participated in extracurricular activities, including either varsity or junior varsity sports.

19. Hughes/Paraskos Family Scholarship

\$250

Awarded to a student with strong academic performance and participate in school sports.

20. Adam Michael Keenan Memorial Athletic Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to a senior student—athlete, who plans to attend either a two or **four-year** college; must have participated in either a varsity or junior varsity sport at LHS and demonstrate good character, a strong work ethic and passion for the sport. The recipient will be selected based on academic record, athletic commitment, exceptional character, and sportsmanship. (Awarded at LHS Athletic Awards Banquet) *Applicants must submit an additional, short paragraph online describing the sport you are passionate about and why, and also, how you have overcome setbacks during your athletic career.*

21. Michael J. Kuenzler Scholarship Fund

\$1,000

Awarded to deserving seniors on the wrestling team who plan to study at a two- or **four-year** academic institution.

22. Amy E. Lekites Memorial Scholarship Fund*

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to deserving female track or cross-country athletes. (Awarded at LHS Athletic Awards Banquet)

23. Luz Family Scholarship Fund

\$500

Award two annual scholarships to graduating Lowell High School students, 1 to a boy and 1 to a girl. The criteria for consideration is Strong Academic Performance and Sports, with preference given to members of the LHS swim team.

24. James S. Martin Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to students with financial need and who have participated in Highland Little League baseball, softball, or basketball teams.

Applicants must describe their participation on the application.

25. Rodger F. Martin Jr. Scholarship Fund

\$350

Awarded to students who intend to pursue a degree in engineering or business, who participated in track and field, and were a pole vaulter or hurdler.

26. Walter L. Nelson Scholarship Fund

\$500 - \$999

Awarded to students who have demonstrated excellence in scholarship and athletics. (Awarded at LHS Athletic Awards Banquet)

27. Michael J. Netishen Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to students who demonstrate financial need and participate in school athletics.

28. Plomaritis Family Foundation Seven Tenets Scholarship Fund*

\$2,500

Awarded to a student who has displayed a high degree of SPORTSMANSHIP while participating in at least one varsity sport at LHS, earned a cumulative 3.0 GPA or higher, and performed volunteer work in the community.

Applicants must also submit the following online:

• An additional essay encompassing your volunteer experience and how you will portray the "SEVEN TENETS" moving forward: DEVELOPMENT, DIRECTION, DISCIPLINE, RESPECT, RESPONSIBILITY, LEADERSHIP, & SPORTSMANSHIP.

29. Brian F. Reynolds Student Athlete Scholarship Fund

\$1,000 - \$1,999

Awarded to one male and one female student who have excellent grades and have excelled at a school sport.

30. Raymond E. Riddick Memorial Scholarship*

\$1,000+

Awarded to deserving students who have a minimum of three years of high school athletics and involved in extracurricular activities or have work experience.

31. Herky Santos Scholarship

\$1,000

Awarded to a student athlete who plans to pursue a career in law enforcement. (Awarded at LHS Athletic Awards Banquet).

32. Thomas "Tiny" Sheehan Scholarship Fund

\$500 - \$999

Awarded to students with financial need who have distinguished themselves through participation in varsity sports and plan to pursue an education at a college or vocational training school.

33. Frederick M. Slavin Track Scholarship Fund*

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to students who have participated in track. (Awarded at LHS Athletic Awards Banquet)

34. Daniel F. Sullivan Jr. Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to students who demonstrate financial need, participate in school athletics, school activities or hold a job after school while at LHS.

35. Chet Szablak Jr. Scholarship Fund

\$1,000

Awarded to graduating seniors who have played football at Lowell High School, have maintained a minimum GPA of 3.0, and will be attending a college where they will continue to play football.

36. Amber Zapatka Memorial Scholarship

\$250+

Awarded to a student who has participated in Crew for a minimum of three years who is hard-working and passionate. (Awarded at LHS Athletic Awards Banquet)

Business

37. 1826 Lowell High Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to a minimum of two and no more than four graduating seniors who have taken a minimum of two Business Education courses at LHS (excluding Office Intern, Work Experience and Marketing Lab) and have received a grade of 85 or above in each course. Preference will be given to students who participated in DECA, Business Professionals of America, or who worked in the School Store. Students must attend a two- or **four-year** institution or technical school.

38. George and Carol Duncan Family Scholarship Fund

\$400

Awarded to a student in the top 1/3 of the graduating class who demonstrates financial need, and plans to study business, finance, or accounting at an accredited college or university.

39. John M. Kenney Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to a student who plans to pursue an education in accountancy or business administration.

40. The Lowell Property and Business Group Scholarship

\$250

Awarded to a graduating senior who demonstrates strong academic performance and financial need; preference given to those with an interest in Entrepreneurship.

41. Ann Burns Murphy Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to a senior from Lowell High School with average or higher grades who is interested in studying business administration or related studies at a two-year or **four-year** institution.

Community Service

42. Align Credit Union Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to one student who demonstrates academic success, has been in a leadership role, and has been actively involved in school, community service, and extracurricular activities.

Applicants must submit an additional online essay on the following topic: Please describe how credit unions positively impact your community (200 words or less).

43. Verda Annan Scholarship Fund

\$250

Two-year scholarship awarded to Lowell High School graduating seniors who will attend a community college. Applicants must have participated in community service and demonstrate financial need.

44. Daniel Crowther Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to a graduating senior who plans to pursue a two- or **four-year** course of higher education and who has demonstrated leadership qualities at Lowell High School and/or the community at large

45. Joan Dunlavey Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to graduating seniors who have performed community service and plan to pursue a degree in Social Work; an academic and professional discipline that seeks to facilitate the welfare of communities, individuals, families, and groups that may promote social change, development, cohesion, and empowerment.

Applicants must submit an additional 300 word essay online on the following topic: Why have I chosen the field of social work.

46. Louis Fineman Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$1,000

Awarded to students who have demonstrated a strong work ethic via academics, school service and work in the community.

47. Friends of Lowell High School Founders Scholarship Fund

\$1,000 - \$1,499

Awarded to graduating seniors who have demonstrated a record of service in student and/or community activities and who plan to attend an accredited two- or **four-year** institution.

To be eligible, a parent or guardian must be a paid member of the FLHS for the current year.

48. Gervais Family Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to students with Community Service & Financial Need. (Pool E)

49. Melvin A. Glazer Scholarship Fund

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to an honors student of strong character with a record of community service who plans to study business at an accredited academic institution.

50. John and Barbara Green Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to students with Community Service & Financial Need. (Pool E)

51. John J. and Clara M. Hurley Scholarship Fund

\$1,500⁺

Awarded to students who demonstrate excellence in scholarship, community involvement, a dedication to the best interests of LHS, and who exhibit financial need.

52. Keller Williams Realty Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to a student who demonstrates financial need and a commitment to community service in the spirit of the Keller Williams motto: "Give where you live."

53. LHS National Honor Society Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to one boy and one girl from Lowell High School's National Honor Society. They must be a member in good standing as verified by the adviser and must plan to attend a **four-year** college.

Gerald R. Wallace Memorial Scholarship

Awarded to students (one male and one female) who have a strong record of community service, demonstrate academic potential and personal character.

\$1,000

Awarded to graduating seniors who have participated in community service and demonstrate financial need.

\$1,000

Awarded to a student each year over four years of attendance at a college or university. The student must fulfill the following three equally weighted criteria (as judged by the Scholarship Advisory Committee):

- a. Achieved a GPA ranking.
- b. Among the top 25% of the graduating class
- c. Established an active commitment to community service through volunteering with one or more community organizations or civic initiatives or have been active in school-based community outreach efforts.
- d. Submit an additional, accomplished essay online describing how he or she has displayed exemplary behavior exercising the golden rule ("Do unto others as you would have others do unto you") in the context of an important personal experience.

58. Echando Pa'lante Latino Scholarship

\$1,000

Awarded to a Lowell High School senior with Community Service and Extracurricular Activates preference given to Latino student.

59. Riddick Family Scholarship Fund

\$1,500+

Awarded to students with strong academics who demonstrate involvement in extracurricular activities at Lowell High School and in the community.

60. Rogers Hall Scholarship

\$1,000

Awarded to a student(s) who demonstrates personal leadership development through community service.

61. Shruti N. Shah Memorial Scholarship

\$1,000

Awarded to graduating seniors with Strong Academic Performance, Community Service and Extracurricular Activities.

62. Peter S. Stamas Scholarship Fund \$1,000

Awarded to students who demonstrate excellence in scholarship and participate in community service and school activities.

63. Sullivan Middle School PTO Scholarship Fund

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to graduates of the Sullivan School who demonstrate financial need, scholarship, and character, as well as participate in community service and school activities.

64. Thomas J. and Mary E. Saab Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to students who demonstrate both excellence in scholarship and financial need.

65. William Samaras/Kendall Wallace Class of 1959 Scholarship Fund

\$1,000

Awarded to a graduating senior who plans to attend UMass Lowell or Middlesex Community College and who has demonstrated leadership qualities at Lowell High School and/or the community at large.

66. Frank D. Weymouth Memorial Scholarship

\$500+

Awarded to a senior who attended or graduated from the Bartlett Community Partnership School. Consideration will be given to academic performance; professional and personal goals; character; financial need; and school, community, or work activities.

67. Kathleen Martin Whittaker Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to students with Strong Academic Performance & Extracurricular Activities.

Computer Science/Information Technology

68. Merrimack Valley Food Bank Scholarship Fund

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to students with a distinguished record of community service and a commitment to study computer science or information technology at the college level.

Education

69. Jodi Paris Anastos Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to LHS students intending to major in biotechnology or bio medical engineering.

70. Cambodian American Scholarship

\$500+

Awarded to three students with a 3.0 GPA or higher who have performed community service: preference given to Cambodian American students.

71. Ernie Descheneaux Memorial Scholarship Award

\$1,000

In memory of Ernie Descheneaux, beloved LHS teacher, mentor and coach. Awarded to a graduating senior with a 3.0 GPA or higher who plans to pursue a degree in Education who has also demonstrated a commitment to assisting others in his/her community through community service and extracurricular activities.

72. Mary F. Hogan Scholarship Fund

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to a student who plans to pursue a post-secondary degree in education at an accredited **four-year** college or university.

73. LHS Class of 1955 Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to students with a B average who want to pursue a teaching degree. Applicants must have participated in sports, been involved in the community, and held a part-time job during high school.

74. Katherine M. Martin Scholarship Fund

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to deserving students who plan to study elementary education at an accredited institution.

75. Jane Cullen McOsker Scholarship Fund \$250

Awarded to a student who plans to study education to become a teacher that demonstrates academic potential and personal character.

76. Rita Sharcoff Mizner and Sidney S. Mizner Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to students who plan to pursue a career in public education.

Applicants must submit an additional essay online describing their interest in pursuing this field.

\$1,500

Awarded to students who plan to pursue a degree in education for the purpose of becoming a teacher at a **four-year** institution.

78. Thomas F. and Helena B. Murphy Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to graduating seniors who plan to pursue a degree in education at a **four-year** institution.

79. William and Patricia Nickles Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to a graduating senior who plans to pursue a degree in Education Major & Financial Need.

80. Kathleen Reticker Scholarship

\$500+

Awarded to a graduating senior who plans to pursue a degree in Early Childhood Education, demonstrates financial need, and a commitment to community service.

Awarded to a student who plans to pursue a degree in education and who has "civic engagement" and/or community service experience.

\$250

Awarded to a Lowell High School graduating senior that's planning to major in Nursing.

English/Poetry/Literature/Journalism

85. John J. Beaulieu Prize for Poetry*

Book Award

Awarded to a student for creating an outstanding work of poetry. Student must submit their work of poetry online, as required below.

Application requirements:

- No more than two typewritten double-spaced 8 ½ x 11 pages.
- Subject matter open, limited only by generally accepted taste and language.
- Stories remain the property of the author. Submitted copies remain property of LHS and will be kept in library in loose-leaf books by year.

86. Berthe M. Desmarais Scholarship Fund

\$1,500+

Awarded to meritorious female graduates who will further their education at an accredited college or university.

87. Jack Kerouac Prize for Literature*

Book Award

Awarded to a student for creating an outstanding short story (fiction). Student must submit their short story online, as required below.

Application requirements:

- No more than two typewritten, double-spaced $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 11$ pages.
- Subject matter open, limited only by generally accepted taste and language.
- Stories remain the property of the author. Submitted copies remain property of LHS and will be kept in library in loose-leaf books by year.

88. Jack Kerouac Scholarship Fund

\$1,000 - \$1,499

Awarded to a student who has distinguished himself or herself academically, wishes to pursue a college degree, and who has created work in prose, poetry, literary criticism, or journalism.

89. Francis X. Moriarty Scholarship Fund

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to a graduate of the Reilly School who has been in the top of his or her class in English, literature, and grammar for four years.

90. J. Stephen Ronan Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to graduating seniors from D House with financial need who will major in English Education.

91. Swartz-Lloyd Love of the English Language Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to a student who plans to major in English or journalism in college and bring beauty and truth to readers. Candidates must have a 2.5 GPA or higher and plan to attend either a two or **four-year** college.

Awarded to female graduates of the Sullivan School.

\$250 - \$499

Awarded to students who plan to pursue a career in journalism. Preference may be given to female applicants.

95. Girls Incorporated Loretta Duncan Scholarship Fund

\$1,000

Awarded to graduating seniors who are past or current members of Girls Inc. and who are planning to attend a two- or **four-year** college or university.

96. Mary Jo (Reilly) Quinlan Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$1,000

Awarded to students with Strong Academic Performance and Financial Need. Preference may be given to Holy Cross.

97. Felicia May Johnston LHS Architecture Scholarship Fund

\$500

Four-year, 1st year \$500, following 3 years \$2,000 each year. Total: \$6,500, awarded to a graduating female senior who demonstrates financial need and a strong academic background who plans to major in Architecture at a post-secondary institution. *Applicants must submit an additional essay: Discuss the importance of female architects in the United States. (500 words required).*

98. Katina Pappas Tsongas Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$1,500 - \$2,000

Awarded to one female Lowell resident.

Applicants must submit an additional essay online that demonstrates their awareness of women's issues. (500 words)

99. Marilyn Swartz-Lloyd Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to a female student with a 3.5 or higher GPA for excellence in scholarship and who also shows interest in making the world a better place. Candidates must attend either a two- or **four-year** college.

Financial Need

100. Arthur C. Anton Scholarship Fund

\$250

Awarded to students with strong academics and financial need.

101. Attorney Maurice Barlofsky Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to one student with financial need for each of their **four-years** of attendance at Boston University.

102. Mary Weems Nealon Humphrey Scholarship Fund

\$500

Awarded to students with strong academic and financial need.

103. Cambodian Mutual Assistance Association (CMAA) Scholarship

\$500

Awarded to a student with Strong Academic Performance and Financial Need; preference given to Cambodian American students.

104. Sithsuon Chan Scholarship

\$250

Awarded to two graduating seniors who have participated in community service and demonstrate financial need.

105. Don Costa Memorial Scholarship Fund

\$1,000 - \$1,499

Awarded to students with financial need. Preference may be given to students who are related to former employees of Colonial Gas.

Applicants must submit an additional short statement online describing your relationship to a former Colonial Gas employee. If none, please state you do not have a relationship with any former employee.

106. Barbara N. Dunsford Scholarship Fund

\$500
