

How do I get to school?

- → LRTA City Bus, walk or ride a bike
- → Bus passes are \$25 per month and can be purchased at the Kennedy Center Booth 145 Thorndike Street 8a.m.-4 p.m, or 100 Hal Street 7 a.m.-7 p.m.
- Or you can pay \$1.25 by the day on the bus.
- → LRTA also comes to LHS once a month, starting August 28th, to sell bus passes in the FA Cafeteria.
- You must show your school ID or LHS Schedule to get a student pass.

How do I get to school?

 - ◆ Tip: Practice taking the bus in your neighborhood before the first day of school.

What time do I need to be in school?

- The Paige Street entrance of the FA opens at 7:15 each day for entry into cafe for breakfast.
- Transition to Advisory begins at 7:40.
- All students must be in Advisory by 7:55.
 - ◆ AFTER 7:55 You will be marked tardy
- First period begins at 8:15.



What are the main rules and policies at Lowell High School and the Freshman Academy?

Lowell High School Attendance Policy

- 8 Unexcused daily absences
 Semester 1 = Absence
 Failure
- ➤ 8 Unexcused daily absences
 Semester 2 = Absence
 Failure
- > 8 Unexcused class absences No credit for the course



Reporting Absences and Dismissing Students

- In order for an absence to be excused you need to provide documentation, i.e. a doctors note, court document, etc.
- > You do not need to email or call to report that your child will be out.
- In order for an adult to dismiss a student from LHS, they must be listed in Aspen as an authorized person to dismiss.
- Authorized adults dismissing students must provide a valid form of ID upon dismissal

No Cell Phones or Earbuds During Academic Classes

- Cell Phones are not allowed in use during academic learning time.
- Cell phones *are* allowed during Advisory and passing time between classes and lunch.
- No ear buds are allowed during active learning.



Process for Turning In Phones

- Students put cell phones in a box as they enter the classroom.
- At the end of the period students take their phones back.
- If there is a safety drill teachers take box out with them.
- No ear buds are allowed during active learning.



Cell Phones Continued

- Videotaping is prohibited in school or on school grounds.
- The use of cell phones in unauthorized ways, including picture taking or filming, harassing, and/or bullying behavior could result in progressive disciplinary action, up to and including suspension.

School Safety

- > Student IDs must be visible around necks at all times.
- ➤ If you lose your ID, you must purchase a new one for \$5
- Detentions will be issued for each day that you do not have an ID.
- Pro Tip: Buy your own lanyard and ID holder.



Dress Code

- → No Hoods
- → No Sunglasses
- → Follow LPS school dress code at all times
- Dress appropriately for a school/professional setting.



Bathroom Use and Sign Out in the FA

- Students sign out of classrooms electronically, and must have a hallway pass.
- Abuse of bathroom use could result in parents being contacted progressive disciplinary action.
- Only 1 student per bathroom stall.





Academic Expectations

Credits Needed to Advance to 10th Grade

- Math, ELA, History, Science, Health/PE, Seminar, Elective
- 20 Credits must be obtained by the conclusion of 9th Grade.
- You MUST PASS ELA and Math in 9th Grade
 - O Summer School is only offered for up to 2 courses
 - You must have at least a 55 average to go to Summer School



Physicals expire 13 months after the date the exam was signed by the physician. A new physical will need to be uploaded to your registration.

Athletic Physicals will be held on @Cawley Stadium on TBD in the athletic trainer's office. These physicals are for returning student-athletes in grades 10-12. Athletic registration must be completed on FamilyID prior to receiving a physical from the Physician.


