

Finalize College List (Develop well-balanced

Stay engaged with your extracurricular activities and commitments outside of school

Register for SATs/ACTs if you plan to take them; many colleges are test optional: fairtest.org

Attend College & Career Center (CCC)

College & Career Fair College Representative Visits CCC Workshops, Events, & Flex Blocks College Week Activities Financial Aid Night Meet individually with your guidance counselor

Complete Common Application, supplements, and/or college specific applications

Finalize College Essay(s)

Send test scores to colleges only if you are applying with test scores

Naviance Tasks

Add Colleges to "Colleges I'm Applying To" Match Naviance & Common App accounts Request Transcripts Request Letters of Recommendation (both in person & on Naviance) Update Resume

Keep track of admissions deadlines and application requirements; submit all application components prior to deadlines

Early Action / Early Decision deadlines

Apply for Financial Aid sooner rather than later! FAFSA opens October 1 at fafsa.gov CSS profile (if applicable)

Apply for scholarships; check Naviance

Additional application materials as required; For example auditions, portfolio, interviews

Be organized & stay on top of deadlines!

Apply for Financial Aid if you have not yet done so: FAFSA & CSS profile (if applicable)

Send in your application materials for schools' regular decision deadlines if you didn't apply early!

The College Landscape - Three Pathways

Path 1

2 Year Colleges /
Community College
= Associate's Degree
Low Cost or Free

Some stop their education with the associates degree - see Path 3 if you want to continue your education Path 2

4 Year Colleges /
Universities =
Bachelors Degree
Higher Cost,
sometimes reduced
by Financial Aid

Path 3

2 Years at Community College (Associates Degree)

AND

2 Years at College or University = Bachelor's Degree Lower Cost as two years are free

2 Years at a MA community college can be free for Massachusetts Residents. By combining the community college and associates degree with a four year college / university, students are able to save money.

2 Year Colleges / Community Colleges Associate's Degree

- <u>Any</u> student with a high school diploma or GED can attend
- Generally, no GPA requirement or SATs (<u>check</u> specific program)
- **For example: Health programs will have additional requirements**
 - Quick application process
 - Transcript required
 - May need to take placement exam before selecting classes (prepare!)

<u> MassTransfer</u>

Once you have completed your Associate's Degree (2 year degree) at a Massachusetts Community College, you can then transfer to a 4 year college to complete your Bachelor's Degree through a program called the Mass Transfer Program.



<u> MassEducate</u>



Free Community College is Here.

No matter your age or income: community college is now free in Massachusetts!

The MassEducate program allows all Massachusetts residents who have not yet earned a bachelor's degree to attend a Massachusetts community college for **free**.

To be eligible for MassEducate, you must:

- Complete the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u> (FAFSA)*
- Apply to your <u>local community college</u> and enroll in an approved program of study.
- Have physically resided in Massachusetts for at least one year, as of the start of your first enrolled term.
- Have earned a high school diploma or the equivalent.
- Are enrolled in at least six credits (usually two classes) per semester in an approved program of study leading to an associate degree or certificate.
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress in accordance with the college's requirements.

*If you are not eligible to complete the FAFSA and are an approved "High School Completer" under the Massachusetts <u>tuition</u> <u>equity law</u>, you can complete the <u>Massachusetts Application for State Financial Aid</u> (MASFA) and still attend for free.

Community Colleges Certificate Programs





Community colleges, such as Middlesex Community College and Northern Essex Community College, offer many certificate programs, such as these below. This is a short list of hundreds of programs offered!

4 Year Colleges / Universities

Bachelor's Degree What are colleges looking at?

- → Strength of classes
- → GPA
- → Essay
- → Letters of recommendation
- → SAT/ACT scores (if required)

Minimum Requirements:

- → 4 years of English
- → 4 years of Math
- → 3 years of Lab Science
- → 2 years of Social Science
- → 2 years of the same World Language

Selective Private Colleges (examples: BU and Northeastern) have more rigorous requirements including supplemental essays, interviews and 4 years of all core academic subjects.

Types of College Admission Deadlines

- Regular Decision: A set deadline which all materials must be submitted by (Example: 1/1, 1/15)
- **Early Action:** <u>Non-binding</u> early deadline Often November 1st, if not sooner!
- Early Decision: <u>Binding</u> contract early deadline
 You *must* attend, if accepted
- Rolling Admission: Applications are accepted & decisions are made on a rolling basis (as they come in) - sooner the better!

Note: Certain programs/majors (ex. Nursing), as well as scholarships, may have early deadlines.

Finalizing Your College List

REACH

- More selective/competitive colleges, your "dream" schools
- Your GPA/SATs fall at/below the average accepted students
- Acceptance rate is less than 30%
- You have reviewed their Net Cost to attend against your Net
 Price Calculator / SAI and you would be able to pay for this school

TARGET

- Your GPA/SATs fit the school's published data on accepted students
- You have reviewed their Net Cost to attend against your Net Price Calculator / SAI and you would be able to pay for this school

LIKELY

- Your GPA/SATs are above the school's published data on accepted students
- Acceptance rate is high (70% or higher chance of acceptance)

A well-balanced list typically has 7-12 schools:

2-4 Likely

3-5 Target

2-3 Reach




- One application for over 1000 schools
- Students need to create an account
- Students add schools to their dashboard on Common App

Transcripts

- Students' academic record throughout high school, includes weighted GPA
- Student must request transcripts in Naviance at least 2 weeks prior to your deadline
 - Transcripts are sent through Naviance by School Counselor

<u> How to Request Transcripts (Video)</u>

Letters of Recommendation

- Students are told to ask their teachers <u>in person</u> first
- Student must also request letters of recommendation through Naviance
- Check college admission website for recommendation requirements
- Please give teachers and school counselors adequate time to complete your letters (at least 15 school days prior to deadlines)

<u> How to Request Letters of Recommendation (Video)</u>

SAT/ACT

- Check individual schools to see if they **require** the SAT or ACT (found on their Admissions page)
- Sign up through CollegeBoard for SAT
- Sign up for ACT at actstudent.org
- Send your scores to college directly through
 CollegeBoard; they do not get sent through Lowell
 High School
- Assistance is available to help you sign up
 - Talk to your counselor, Trio/Gear Up advisor, or visit the College and Career Center



SAT Fall 2024

- SATs are now digital!
- Students are responsible for registering on <u>College</u>
 <u>Board</u>

Test (SAT/ACT) Optional

Many, **but not all**, schools are test-optional.



FAFSA

- FREE to complete on <u>studentaid.gov</u>
- Opens in December this year submit as soon as possible after it is open
- All colleges require FAFSA for students to be eligible for grants, loans, (some) scholarships, and work-study

CSS Profile

- SOME private colleges/universities will require (in addition to FAFSA)
- Available on collegeboard.org; fees apply

Always check the colleges' financial aid websites for the forms they require and their financial aid deadlines.
