Honors Night Eligibility

Open to any Lowell High School senior who:

- ➤ Has a minimum 2.5 GPA*
- Attended Lowell High School as a Junior and Senior Student has to have attended LHS since 10/1 of their junior year
- > Will further their education in the Fall 2025
- Meets other eligibility criteria specified by individual scholarships

For students who have a 2.3 GPA and were invited to attend today's meeting, please remember that you must have a 2.5 GPA after Q2 grades have been recalculated on the transcript. Please check in with your guidance counselor or College & Career Center to confirm you are eligible before submitting your application.

Application Requirements

Students need to complete & submit the following:

- Online Honors Night Application (Complete all questions!)
- ID Only Transcript with Semester 1 grades
 - Will be made available as a published report in Aspen shortly *after* Q2 grades are issued (*on 2/7 pending successful release of grades by that date; possibly earlier*)
 - Student uploads the transcript (PDF) to their scholarship application on or after this date

<u>Do NOT upload any other transcript! You will be notified when the ID only transcript is available.</u>

- Required essay (300 word maximum); <u>No names or identifying information in the essay</u>
- > Any other required documents specified by individual scholarships
 - Additional essays, poems, short stories, and /or letters of recommendation, community service documentation, etc.

Honors Night Essay Requirements

Please upload a 250-300 word essay on the following topic:

SOME STUDENTS HAVE A BACKGROUND, IDENTITY, INTEREST, OR TALENT THAT IS SO MEANINGFUL THEY BELIEVE THEIR APPLICATION WOULD BE INCOMPLETE WITHOUT IT. PLEASE SHARE YOUR STORY.

Please note:

- > Additional essays may be required; check each individual scholarship carefully
- > Do not put your name in your essay NO personal identifier
- Edit your essay for grammar, spelling and appropriate punctuation
- To protect your privacy, do not share confidential details you do not want others to know
- Ask someone to proofread your essay

Reminder: Honors Night Application is "ID Only"!

Your name should NOT appear on the application, essay, transcript, or letters of recommendation.

Important Dates

- Application opens: 1/24 at 9am
- > 2/7: Transcripts available to upload (possibly earlier)
 - Start early! It is recommended that you complete/submit your application on 2/7 to see your full list of eligible scholarships!
 - Your completed answers in the application will generate your final list of matching scholarships, including extra essay prompts, letters of recommendation, etc.
 - **Plan ahead!** Some scholarships require a letter of recommendation, and the applicant will need to send a request link to the recommender, but you cannot access the request link until after you have submitted your application.
- Application deadline: 2/26 at 11pm
 No late applications will be accepted! The portal shuts off at this time!
 All questions must be complete for a successful submission.



2025 Honors Night Scholarship Information:

The 2025 Honors Night Scholarship Student Informational Meeting will be held on Thursday, January 23rd at 9am in the cafeteria. To be eligible for Honors Night scholarships, students must have a minimum 2.5 GPA*, have attended Lowell High School since 10/1 of their junior year, will further their education in the Fall of 2025, and meet other eligibility requirements specified by individual scholarships.

*Students who have at least at 2.3 GPA are invited to attend the informational meeting due to the opportunity to achieve a 2.5 or higher GPA before Q2 grades close.

There will be a virtual Honors Night Scholarship Information Session for parents/guardians on Monday, 1/27 from 5:30pm-6:30pm. The meeting link will be sent to all eligible seniors and parents/guardians.

The Honors Night Scholarship application will open Friday, January 24 and close on Wednesday, February 26th at 11PM. The application link will be available to students in their Naviance accounts, or students can access the application on the Greater Lowell Community Foundation online scholarship portal.

Students are encouraged to apply early.

Honor's Night Application Instructions

- Click "Create New Account" & enter your contact information (use your personal email)
- Click "next" to set-up your password, followed by "create account"
- Check your personal email to confirm you received an email from the GLCF
- > Return to your application to check off "I have received the email"
- When you see the "2025 LHS Honors Night Scholarship Application", click "Apply"
- > Complete **all** application questions and the general essay
 - If you miss a question, you will not be able to submit
 - Click on the arrow next to the application section to see all of the questions (if they are not visible)
 - You can return to your application by clicking "edit application" when you log in

Application Instructions (cont.)

- It is recommended that you complete all questions and submit your application early
 - Scholarships that require extra essays/letters of recommendation will not appear until you submit the primary application first
 - If you wait until the last minute to apply, you will not have enough time to complete additional requirements
- After you submit, if you are eligible for additional scholarships, the list will appear
 - You will need to click on each scholarship to complete and upload the required essay question, statement, poem / short story, letter of recommendation, etc.
- Review your list of all matching scholarships; view the scholarship bulletin to view the scholarship criteria.

Tsongas Scholarship Application Process & Requirements

- Complete the <u>Tsongas Scholarship Application</u>
 - The scholarship link will be a checklist item on the student's admissions portals
- Acceptance to UMass Lowell for the Fall 2025 semester
- > 3.0 GPA minimum requirement
- Completed & submitted Honors Night application and general essay
- Additional Tsongas essay (550 words max.):

Discuss your service to the school and/or community and the effect that this service has had on your life and those you served.

- > Three letters of recommendation to be submitted online
 - <u>1 letter must be from a community service supervisor</u>

Tsongas Scholarship Application Process & Requirements, *continued*

- Tsongas Scholarship Community Service Form
 - Form available in Naviance and on LHS Scholarship website
 - Signed and submitted online by a supervisor that verifies the dates, hours & services
 - If you completed community service at multiple agencies, each supervisor must complete the form to receive credit for your hours; multiple forms must be uploaded as one PDF
- > Resume
- LHS will load transcript for eligible candidates
- Submit application materials via the UML link, including the application, Honors Night General Essay, Tsongas Essay, letters of recommendation, Community Service Form, resume and ID only transcript <u>by Feb. 26, 2025 at 11:00pm</u>. *No late entries will be accepted.*
- > Finalists will be selected for an interview with a scholarship panel
 - \star Interviews will be conducted for the top six candidates.
 - ★ Two scholarship recipients will be selected.


